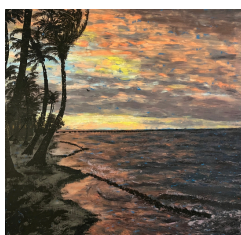
This month, we feature Evie Walberg who celebrates nature's energy and color with her paintbrush.

Evie Walberg, a born and raised Texan, has always appreciated the outdoors. Her love of nature, its brilliant colors, shifting shadows, and rich textures, serves as the foundation for her art. Whether exploring the Texas countryside or traveling to new landscapes, Evie finds endless inspiration in the beauty of the world around her. Her artwork reflects the energy she feels in nature, inviting viewers not only to see her creations but to feel them. Drawing from her passion for photography, Evie often begins with her own images, using them to study how light, shadow, and texture interact in both natural and manmade scenes. These studies evolve into vivid paintings and intricate lino block prints, hand-pressed in limited editions.

Blending elements of Impressionism and Expressionism, Evie works with brushes and palette knives to capture color, movement, and emotion. Water is one of her favorite subjects—the way sunlight dances across creeks, ponds, and oceans continually inspires her.

In addition to her original works, Evie also creates commissions and pet portraits, collaborating closely with clients to craft personal, meaningful pieces.

THE OCTOBER MEETING IN REVIEW

Inkjet 101: Learning all about inkjet printing and papers

At our latest Art Guild member meeting, we were joined by Drew Hendrix, President of Red River Paper.

Drew Hendrix, owner of Red River Paper, brought us an in-depth tutorial on all things printing paper. He noted that the use of paper is still high, despite email and the internet.

There are five types of printing papers available: a PhotoBase paper, typically used in standard photos; matte paper, which is flat and has no reflection; fine art paper, which can be matte or reflective; Baryta papers; and specialty types. The image we are printing and how we want it to look will determine the best paper to choose.

Drew described the various characteristics to select from regardless of which type of paper you choose. He talked about weight and thickness, which will vary from copy paper to cover stock. He also discussed brightness vs. whiteness, and he advised us to be more concerned with whiteness, which determines the quality of reflected light.

Drew then explained the cost of doing our own inkjet

printing. He noted that it's more cost effective per print than sending it out to a photo lab. In addition, it's more flexible and faster. He described the various printers available and explained that there is not a dramatic difference in the print quality of a less expensive vs. a more expensive printer. In determining which printer to buy, it's best to consider your budget, the size of print you want, if it needs to be fade-resistant for 20+ years or 50+ years, and if black and white printing is critical. He urged us to calibrate our monitor regularly for consistent prints.

Red River has helpful information on their website, redrivercatalog.com, such as how to order a sample pack of paper or greeting cards, and how to install printer profiles on your home printer. Thank you so much to Drew for helping us understand the ins and outs of inkjet printing!

After Drew's presentation, several members participated in the monthly challenge by sharing their artwork on the theme "The Press." All members who participated entered their names in a drawing for the prize of free \$10 entry into the next month's member exhibit at the WCAG Gallery.

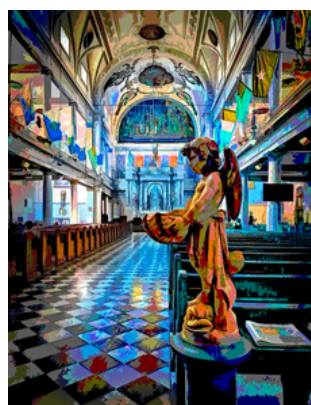
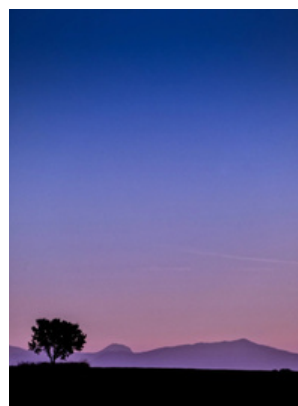
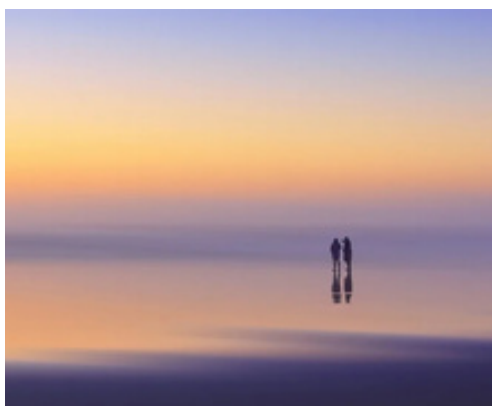
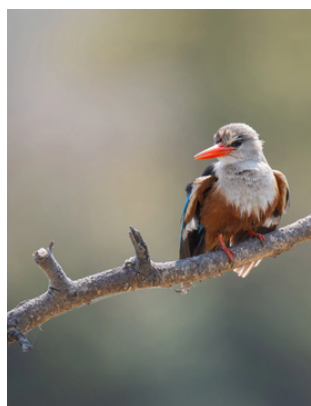
Celebrating our talented artists and award winners in Georgetown's statewide juried exhibit!

Jessica Cook is a figurative and still life painter. She paints in a gestural style and seeks to capture the essence of everyday life, infusing it with movement and energy.

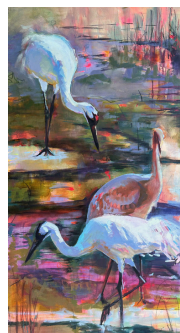

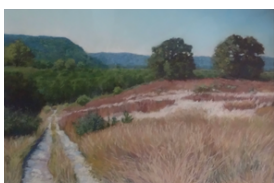

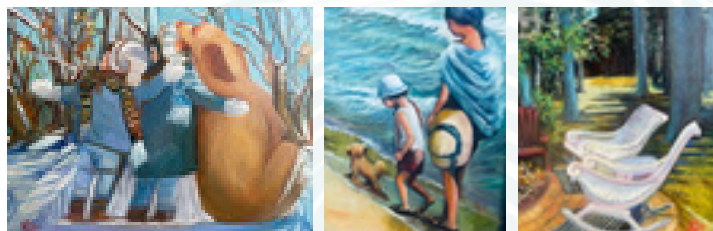

Your Abstract Journey with Sue Bishop

A non-objective abstract painting is a painting that has no visual subject matter. "Are you telling me that this is a workshop that teaches you to paint nothing?" "Yes, I am."

I know this sounds strange, but the paint is not just thrown on the canvas. This process takes thought and knowledge to produce "consistently" good non-objective paintings. I will guide you through the process of mixing colors, drawing lines and painting shapes arbitrarily on your substrate. Once chaos is created, you will be shown a process that reins in the chaos and a well designed non-objective painting will be created.



This workshop benefits the artist that has some knowledge of painting in acrylic to the advanced artist. There will be demos to guide you through each step of the process, along with one-on-one instruction. You will be given a booklet that contains all the information from the class. While on this Abstract Journey, you will be shown a process that answers the question of how to paint nothing, and you will also have a lot of fun.
